



Safety Training Regulations

Safety training is a graduation requirement for CBMB students in accordance with the Labour Safety and Health Act and the Regulations for Labour Safety and Health Education and Training. Please comply with the regulations and guidelines stated below based on your registered department/institute/college at National Taiwan University or National Tsing Hua University to finish the required safety training; otherwise, you may not be able to graduate. Please note that all students should attend safety training courses in accordance with the requirements set by BOTH their registered university and Academia Sinica. Regulations may be adjusted in accordance with rule changes made by the responsible party/parties.

Note: all CBMB students should carry out extra safety training courses where required, such as biosafety or radiation safety. This is the case for research related to radiation, infectious biological materials management, and testing of transmittable disease in patients and toxic chemical substances. The students are responsible for any consequences of failing to complete related training before conducting research or experiments. - A.** Local and international CBMB students conducting experiments fully in Academia Sinica **must** attend at least **8** hours of safety training for the 1st year and at least **4** hours training every year before graduation, including the year of graduation. This training will be carried out by the relevant institute, office, or research centre in Academia Sinica. - B.** Local and international CBMB students registered with the Department of Chemistry at National Taiwan University and conducting experiments fully in NTU **must** attend safety training course carried out by NTU in years 1, 4, and 7, and at least 1 hour training in years 2, 3, 5, and 6 carried out by either the relevant NTU CHEM department. If you choose to watch the relevant videos for years 2, 3, 5, and 6, students must download the “compulsory safety training form” to obtain signatures. Students need to fulfil NTU CHEM requirements as well as the Academia Sinica requirements.
